Professional Development and Related Programs being funded for 2011-12 by RttT

- Everyday Math – follow-up sessions that will include large group as well as instructor going to each classroom to help individual teachers with their implementation of the program.
- Physical science workshop – Columbus- grades 6,7,8 science instructors – to provide information about improving physical science instruction for the OAA/OGT tests.
- Reading instruction – funded with School Improvement money for South and RttT for all elementary buildings, these program will provide large group as well as coaching opportunities (professional staff working with each teacher) for each elementary Reading teacher.
- Science Instruction sessions for high school science staff
- PD sessions on use of Instructional Improvement System as being developed through state computer software system
- Books and reference materials supporting instructional “Best Practices.”
- Conferences regarding changes being required by budget bill for teacher and administrative evaluations
- Transition (RttT leadership) team activities.
